Cream Tea.	Homemade scones cut in halves with jam, clotted cream and fresh strawberry, individually plated and with a choice of tea or coffee. A gluten free and Vegan alternative is available.	£6.00
Afternoon Tea	3 pieces of sandwiches, filled with egg and cress, ham with red onion marmalade, smoked salmon and herbs cream cheese with cracked black pepper, half scone with jam, clotted cream and strawberry, a sliced of lemon drizzle, chocolate tart, individually plated and with a choice of tea or coffee. Ploughmans.	Hand carved ham and a selection of cheeses, served with pickles, celery, grapes, chutney, fresh tomato, crusty roll with butter, and some coleslaw salad, individually plated A gluten free and Vegan alternative is available.	£8.00
Finger Buffet.	Individually plated finger food comprising, 3 pieces of sandwiches, filled with egg and cress, ham with red onion marmalade, smoked salmon and herbs cream cheese Individually plated with cracked black pepper, Gloucestershire old spot sausage roll, tortilla wrap with Parma ham and asparagus, cheese and onion quiche and a slice of Victoria sponge.
